Call to Order: Thom Clark called the meeting to order at 6:25 pm

Program Committee

Elizabeth Harano spoke on the spreadsheet of priority of topics for Chicago Tonight, including cultural, social events, arts, entertainment, public affairs, politics, legal issues, gay, civil and women's rights, myriad of subjects.

Elizabeth talked on responding to complaints and proposals brought to the station. Procedure for CAB responding to complaints – complaints are generated either internally or externally; correspondence is sent to Chairperson and then to Programming Committee. Those complaints sent directly to station are dealt with by station management. Sometimes, but rarely, are those complaints directed to CAB.

CAB members are also eligible for speaking. However, Programming Committee will bring in resource speakers to speak on issues of the day to help the station expand their resources.

Outreach Committee

Lorenzo Vazquez spoke on tapping the pulse of the surrounding community, i.e., townhall meetings, publicly announced meetings, different web presence for programming.

Management Feedback

VJ McAleer indicated that Geoffrey Baer will have two new programs this summer on Fox River Valley and Southwest Suburbs.

WTTW will, in partnership with Children's Brain Research Foundation, present a program in September 2006 on dealing with bullies.

More programming planned with Chicago History Museum entitled "Sensing Chicago" that will urge children to use their senses to discovery Chicago's history.

Outreach program will be a training session for Chicago Public School Teachers that will teach youngsters about science and astrology
